*Discussion by Commissioner Micuda, Carl Martin, Chairman Hartley, Scott Richardson, Lisa Gervase and Blair Driggs. Concerns were vocalized about the extent of the Friday Group’s meetings. Commissioner Micuda stated the group are stakeholders flushing out problems. If the Committee has some issues and recommendations the group is able to identify such as: the business license name change and joint responsibility. This Committee is able to flush out different perspectives which enables the Commission to make better policy. It is a latitude for the group to make recommendations to the Commission. The Committee is complying with the open meeting laws and keeping minutes which has not been done in the past. The group consists of people from the industry and the Commission who are part of the Friday group. Mr. Richardson stated he has been on dozen of committees, and now feels something is being done. Previously, Mr. Richardson sat on the WIR committee and it went no where. They are people with a common interest to recognize the issues that face the public and industry. This group gets the people to talk about the issues, decrease the level of mis-trust between the industry and the Commission. There is communication with the industry, staff and the public. Chairman Hartley stated overall, the group that has been meeting has been healthy. Chairman Hartley thinks the information should be apart from the Commission and not be a “shadow of the Commission” and the APMA or public should deal with these issues. Commissioner Micuda asked where is the controversy? Chairman Hartley stated the APMA report dated September 10, 2002 which quoted Scott Richardson that “there are no more covert inspections.” It was questioned of who from SPCC staff said there are no more covert inspections. Scott Richardson commented the Committee was to look at CBT, Test Results and the Matrix. Chairman Hartley asked Mr. Richardson if he knew what is the definition of a “Shadow Commission” if he knew what it*

meant. Blair Driggs stated the Commission should not have a general Committee, but should have a specific Committee and they should comply with the open meeting laws. Commissioner Hale agreed with Chairman Hartley the Committee should have a specific configuration. It was questioned of who wrote the Memo on behalf of the Committee and Carl Martin stated he wrote it and will stand by it. Lisa Gervase stated she would like to mediate some of this. The Committee was to look at Label-Laws/Rules and resolve Matrix issues. In Ms. Gervase's notes from September 27, 2002 any idea that has not been authorized by the Commission has to go back to the Commission. Chairman Hartley takes the responsibility for not defining what were the issues for the Committee and by not giving clear directions. Two Motions were made during this discussion one by Commissioner Micuda and the other by Commissioner Peterson. Both Motions were withdrawn by Commissioner Micuda and Commissioner Peterson. The Motions were "that we set up a Laws/Rules Committee" and "One Committee we have standing is gone and appoint a new committee who will move forward come back and report to the Commission next month." Commissioner Fraker commented that the Committee was formed for HB 2189 and CBT. Commissioner Fraker stated HB 2189 encompasses a lot of areas and vast items to implement. Commissioner Micuda stated the Committee has looked at 2189, Joint Responsibility, Business Name Changes, Variances and Label should be the law. Each one of these item is complicated and he feels the Committee has come up with some options and the Committee has not gone amuck with issues. Commissioner Micuda commented he has sat on another Committee that has done their Rules which took them 1 ½ years to do and in the two years nothing has been done for the SPCC Rules. Dirk S. VandenBerg, Sr., was confused on the Rules Committee. Mr. VandenBerg stated they have accomplished a lot on the Joint Responsibility. It was stated there was already a Statutes and Rules Committee and no other Committee needed to be formed.
